## **Stanislaus County Libraries to celebrate TeenTober**

*Stanislaus County Library to join libraries nationwide in celebrating teens and teen library services*

This October, libraries across the country are celebrating TeenTober, the Young Adult Library Services Association's (YALSA) month-long event in celebration of teens, teen services, and the ways those services help teens develop new skills and pursue their passions. Stanislaus County Library will join in the celebration by offering a variety of programs created especially for TeenTober, including the library's annual Teen Anime Day celebration on Saturday, Oct. 19.

A month of TeenTober events will kick off at 3 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 1 at the Oakdale Library. Teens are invited to paint the bookends in the library's Teen section. On Tuesday, Oct. 22 the Oakdale Library will host a DIY calming jar craft at 3 p.m. Teens will create and customize their calming jars using glass jars filled with glitter.
