Ages 18 and up are invited to visit the library on Monday, May 7 at 6 p.m. to create their own spa treats. Participants will learn how to make bath salts, lip balms, and more.

Children can make bird seed ornaments on Tuesday, May 8 at 4 p.m. All ages are welcome to participate, however children 4 and under must have direct parental supervision.

Wiggle Worms will be held every Wednesday at 10 and 11 a.m. Wiggle Worms is a special Story Time program designed for babies, active toddlers, and adult caregivers, however all ages are welcome to attend.
