IV. Old Business –

A. Stanislaus Reads – Susan Lilly explained the plan to get many reading the same book by age group. The primary book is Wisdom of the Last Farmer by David Mas Masumoto. Esperanza Rising and Apples to Oregon are the other books. They would like to host author visits with book discussions and signings.

B. Strategic Planning – Vanessa Czopek spoke of work from this fall into the spring to create a blueprint to move into the future for the next five years. Ruth Metz is facilitating focus groups. A survey for the public in English and Spanish is online. The Strategic Planning Committee will use data from focus groups and survey. Meetings (Jan 22, Feb 26, Mar 26) will be held in Modesto Library Auditorium to compact down the data and see what direction the library should be going. Staff will perform a SWOT (Strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, threats), then work on goals. Vanessa would like the process to be complete by the end of March.

V. New Business

A. Library Foundation Report – The Library Foundation is meeting to work on their strategic plan. They wish to host an author spotlight series. They are sponsoring Halloween parties to promote friend raising, one of their 2010 goals.

- C. Outreach Activities – Susan Lilly said they are doing the same things though ramping it up. She shared their plan to bring in something to encourage, trying to reach different audiences. Sheridan is presenting next week at the county supervisors meeting.
  - D. County Librarian’s Report – Vanessa Czopek – The library donation button is up and running; it was made easy to use. The quarterly fiscal report was distributed. The 5% salary reduction with the two days per week the library is closed will continue next year. Retirement costs are expected to increase by 75% next fiscal year. Vanessa handed out a flyer for CALTAC Workshops in Feb. and March. She announced library management changes; Charles Teval will exclusively manage the regional libraries and Amy Taylor will manage the Modesto Library. The County Office of Education has a new initiative – civility, a core value of a well functioning society which seems to be declining. They will launch on Nov. 2<sup>nd</sup> with a breakfast, one can sign up through their web site. Vanessa passed out the book Choosing Civility by P.M. Forni with instructions to read and pass it on.
