July Events at the Hughson Library

Community members are invited to participate in free events at the Hughson Library this July.

Preschool Story Time will be held on Thursdays at 10:30 a.m. Story Times feature new and classic picture books, flannel board and puppet stories, fingerplays, music and dancing, for preschoolers ages 3 to 5 and their caregivers, however all ages are welcome.

Families can enjoy a free performance from ventriloquist Tony Borders on Thursday, July 5 at 1 p.m. This imaginative show will feature a talkative map, animals from around the world, music and more. This program is sponsored by the Stanislaus Library Foundation.

The Summer Read Share program will be held on Tuesday, July 10 at 1 p.m. All ages are invited to share their favorite summer books. Participants will receive recommendations on books to take to the beach, on vacation, or to lounge with at home. This event is sponsored by the Friends of the Hughson Library.

The "Around the World" programs will continue this July, inspired by this year's Summer Reading Challenge theme of "Reading Takes You Everywhere." The program on Wednesday, July 11 from 2 to 4 p.m. will feature the continent of Europe. Children can make paper windmills, paper nesting dolls, handprint tulips, and build the Leaning Tower of Pisa out of cups. Participants will also learn games from Finland and Sweden, and play a round of London Bridge. On Wednesday, July 18 from 2 to 4 p.m. children will learn about the continent of North America by making stick mounties, bald eagle paper bags, maracas, and dreamcatchers. Children can also play indoor hockey, Miss Mary Mack, Las Chivas (Beans), and Quaquatsewa-iu (Stick Drop). Children will learn about South American cultures on Wednesday, July 25 from 2 to 4 p.m. The program will feature South American inspired crafts, such as rainsticks and worry dolls, as well as music and books. These programs are sponsored by the Friends of the Hughson Library.

Community members are invited to join the library on Thursday, July 12 from 12 to 6 p.m. for the "Hughson Library Gives Back" program. The library is inviting people to help give back to the community by painting rocks to spread inspirational messages and images of kindness, writing letters or drawing pictures for
