April Events at the Nick W. Blom Salida Regional Library

The Nick W. Bloom Salida Regional Library will offer free programs for children, teens and adults this April, beginning with "On the Road to Citizenship: Naturalization 101" on Monday, April 3 at 6 p.m. A representative from the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services will give an overview of what it takes to become a citizen and how eligibility is determined. The program will address the naturalization interview and how to avoid potential scams.
