July Events at the Turlock Library

Community members of all ages are invited to take advantage of free events at the Turlock Library this July, beginning with "Where in Turlock?" Throughout the month, five images will be displayed at the library, and participants will have a chance to guess where in Turlock the images were taken. All participants will receive a Hershey's Kiss for playing, and be entered into a drawing for a grand prize.

"STEAM* Works: Ice Cream" will take place on Tuesday, July 3 at 4 p.m. (*STEAM: Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math) Following a reading of Peter Sis' *Ice Cream Summer*, children will have an opportunity to make vanilla ice cream, while supplies last.

Wiggle Worms will be held every Wednesday at 10 and 11 a.m. Wiggle Worms is a special Story Time program designed for babies, active toddlers, and adult caregivers, however all ages are welcome to attend. Wiggle Worms participants can enjoy stories, lap bounces, music, dancing, rhythm activities, fingerplays and more.

Preschool Story Time will be held on Thursdays at 10 and 11 a.m. Story Times feature new and classic picture books, flannel board and puppet stories, fingerplays, music and dancing, for preschoolers ages 3 to 5 and their caregivers, however all ages are welcome.

The Turlock Teens Talk Books program will be held on Saturday, July 7 at 3 p.m. This program provides teens with the opportunity to discuss their favorite books and find new book recommendations.
