Annual Book Sale by Jackie Oyer

The Friends of the Turlock Public Library book sale came to a successful end on Saturday, January 26. Our Thursday night member's-only sale was well attended. In addition to the many current members who were shopping, there were twenty-two who renewed their memberships and thirty-seven people who joined.

The public sale held on Friday and Saturday drew sizable crowds. The sale ran smoothly with the help of seasoned and new volunteers restocking tables, answering questions, tallying books and cashiering. The old and special tables seemed to have many people browsing and purchasing older books.

The sale receipts were \$5,639, and after expenses the projected net income is \$4,989. The Building Fund Donation jar took in \$374.

We were fortunate to have many student volunteers as well as adults to box and move all remaining books. Tables were broken down and put away. This may not sound like a real achievement, but there were 252 boxes of unsold books and the total clean-up time was sixteen minutes from start to finish. PRETTY IMPRESS-IVE!!



under the library portico.




Stanislaus County Library Annual Report

Stop by the children's area or ask the library staff about these brochures.






Who says that no one reads books anymore? Crowds of people of all ages filled the First United Methodist Church's social hall during most of the book sale.

Funds from the book sale are used to provide materials for the weekly after-school programs for children, to enhance the teen book club and advisory board meetings, and to provide materials for the craft programs for children and adults. The Stanislaus Library's annual report was published recently. The Turlock Library continues to have strong circulation and foot traffic numbers, and our public internet access is heavily used. We have the second highest figures in all of these areas, right behind the Modesto Library.

Discover & Go

Discover & Go is a partnership between libraries and cultural institutions. With Stanislaus County Library card, you can reserve FREE and discounted passes to local museums and cultural attractions through the Discover & Go online portal.

- Adults residing in Stanislaus County and ages 18 and over with a library card in good standing can reserve Discover & Go passes.
- If you experience any problems logging in, please contact your local library to check on your account.
- You can have up to 2 active reservations at a time.
- You can make reservations up to 3 months in advance.
- All free tickets are first come, first served, until all tickets are exhausted for the month.
 New passes are released at the beginning of the month.
- Reservations can be canceled only if the pass has not been printed. Log into Discover
 & Go to cancel your reservation online.
- Some venues have placed a 1-pass-per-year restriction and you will only be able to reserve those passes once per calendar year.
- Read all the details on each venue before making a reservation.
- The pass is only valid for the name and date on the pass. Valid photo ID is required.

How to Reserve a Museum Pass

- 1. Visit Discover & Go and login using your library card number and PIN
- 2. Browse by museum or date
- 3. Make a reservation by selecting a date and venue
- 4. Shortly before your visit, print out your pass.
 - O Note: You cannot cancel your passes once they have been printed.
